NPU-L VOTING RULES per 2020 Bylaws

Eligible members shall be any person 18 years of age or older whose primary place of residence is within the NPU-L designated area or a representative of any corporation, organization, institution, or agency which owns property or has a place of business or profession within NPU-L designated area (Article IV, Sec. 4.1 A and 4.1B). To be eligible to vote on matters other than the election of officers, a member must have attended two NPU-L meetings within the last six months. To vote on the election of officers of NPU-L, a member must attend four meeting between the months of January and October (Article IX, Sec. 9.1 and 9.2). **Please sign in to ensure your attendance is recorded for voting eligibility.**



MATTERS FOR VOTING

NPUs provide recommendations to the City of Atlanta by voting to support or oppose applications. The application and the NPU's recommendations, along with Staff recommendations, are then considered by the appropriate board, association, commission, or office.
