



Report a Tree Problem

Trees on Public Property

The City of Atlanta Arborist Division, Office of Natural Resources within the Department of Parks and Recreation oversees permitting of trees on public property and in the City right-of-way (which is typically the space between sidewalks and the street or the space where a sidewalk could be placed if not present)

For problems or issues with trees on public property, please submit a request through the ATL311 system by calling 404-546-0311, visiting ATL311.com, using the ATL311 mobile app, or contact Parks Customer Service at 404-546-6813 or parkscustomerservice@atlantaga.gov

Examples of issues that may be reported to the Department of Parks and Recreation:

- Dead, dying, or hazardous trees in parks and in rights-of-way
- Trees with dead limbs in parks and in rights-of-way
- Tree stumps in parks and in rights-of-way
- Potential illegal removal or destruction of trees on public land.
- Tree save fence is down or improperly placed during construction on public land.
- Potential destruction of trees on public land during construction.

Trees on Private Property

The City of Atlanta Arborist Division, Office of Buildings within the Department of City Planning is charged with protecting the City's tree canopy on private property throughout the City.

Examples of issues that may be reported to the Arborist Division (Department of City Planning):

- Potential illegal removal of a tree on private property
- Tree save fence is down or improperly placed during construction.
- Potential destruction of trees during construction.
