The Mayor's Office of Violence Reduction (MOVR), in coordination with the Atlanta Alliance Against Trafficking Taskforce, leads the City of Atlanta's unified Anti-Human Trafficking strategy for the 2026 FIFA World Cup and beyond. This coordinated effort integrates survivor-centered intake and care, community-based prevention, intelligence-led enforcement, and seamless collaboration across local, state, and federal agencies, nongovernmental organizations, hospitality partners, law enforcement, and transportation stakeholders.
